

Heart City Health was the recipient of a \$300,000 Oral Health Grant from Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) and received additional grant dollars from the United Way of Elkhart and LaGrange Counties and the Community Foundation of Elkhart County.

These funds assisted us with the purchase and complete renovation of a 4,200 square-foot building located at 2100 Superior Street, Elkhart. This allowed our overcrowded dental office to move from the lower level of our Simpson Avenue location to a brand-new location.

Quality work from our friends at Ancon Construction allowed our state-of-the-art dental office to open to the public in July 2019. The facility boasts 11 exam chairs and provides a complete range of high-quality dental services. Our two dentists (Dr. Tia Jeffers and Dr. Mark Green) have a combined 55 years of experience and are excited for the opportunity these grants have provided in treating an increased number of patients from throughout Elkhart and surrounding communities.

When our dental office vacated the basement of our Simpson location, it presented an opportunity for us to renovate that same space and expand our Behavioral Health services. The renovations to our Simpson Avenue lower level allowed for the addition of more mental health providers, an expansion of services and more patients served.
